### Assignment Description

Having explored the root causes of a racialized climate issue and explored their own positionality, participants will compile an annotated bibliography in anticipation of their final project. This annotated bibliography will synthesize academic and research sources, popular media sources, and non-traditional sources grounded in community. Participants will evaluate the annotated bibliographies of two of their peers (Feb 11<sup>th</sup> meeting) and conduct a self-evaluation after having written their final paper.

The annotated bibliography must include at least 10 sources, with five annotations and at least one annotation for each of the following categories: 1) academic and research sources, 2) popular media sources, and 3) non-traditional sources grounded in community. The maximum word count for the annotated bibliography is 1000 words.
